**PROCEEDINGS**

**OF THE GOVERNING COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 08/09/2018 AT THE PRINCIPAL'S CHAMBER OF SAI VIDYA INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY, RAJANUKUNTE, BENGALURU 560 064.**

The Governing body Meeting started as per the schedule.

The Chairman, Governing Council welcomed all the members, especially Dr Subramanya Swamy (nominee from VTU) who has attended the SVIT College G.C. Meeting for the first time.

**SUBJECT - 1** The Chairman requested the Principal to present a brief report about the progress made by the Institution during the academic year 2017-18. (Point No. 2 in the agenda).

Accordingly, Principal, welcoming the members once again, gave a detailed Power Point Presentation of the activities of the Institution. Following are some of **highlights**:

**1. PROFESSIONAL BODY STUDENTS' CHAPTERS**

- Institute of Electrical & Electronics Engineers (IEEE).
- Computer Society of India (CSI).
- Indian Society for Heating Refrigeration and Air-conditioning Engineers (ISHRAE).
- IEEE Photonics Society.
- IEEE Engineering in Medicine and Biology (IEEE EMBS).
- IEEE Power and Energy Systems Society.
- Association of Consulting Civil Engineers (India) (ACCE).

**2. NPTEL ACTIVITIES**

- SVIT has NPTEL local chapter which offers various MOOC courses from IIT for both students and faculties.
- Many students and faculties actively taken up the courses on various trendy topics and obtained certification.
- SVIT-NPTEL Local Chapter - 1100 + students (2400 course registrations) and staff have registered for online courses from NPTEL, COURSERA, UDACITY.

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### 3. OFFERING B.E. HONS DEGREE

- If a student completes 20 credits of MOOC courses along with regular credits, **BE (Hons) degree will be awarded instead of BE** as per AICTE.
- SVIT is heading to promote the same and facilitating every student to attain BE (Hons) Degree instead of BE degree.

### 4. ON GOING R&D FUND PROJECTS

- Dr. Narayan, Dean (R&D), Professor, Department of ECE has received **Rs.24.55 Lakhs grant** from **DST** for the project "*Design, Analysis and Modeling of Lab-on-a-Chip Opt fluidic Bio-sensor*".
- Dr. Narayan, Dean (R&D), Professor, Department of ECE has received **Rs.30 Lakhs grant** from **VGST** for the proposal "*Design and Modeling of Micro Opto-Electro-Mechanical Systems (MOEMS) based Bio-Sensors for Lab-on-a-Chip Applications*" under **Centre's of Innovative Science & Engineering Education (CISEE)** scheme.

### 5. R&D FUNDS APPLIED FOR

- 12 research proposals were sent to VGST for funding, by various departments.
- A research proposal is sent for a funding of 50 lakhs, by Dr. Narayan, Dean R & D to DST.
- 2 proposals sent under DST -Teacher Associate-ship for Research Excellence (TARE).
- A student project from Mechanical Department has received funding from ISHREA of RS. 50,000/-.

### 6. R&D FUNDS RECEIVED

- **4 UG projects proposals** was funded by **KSCST**.
- **6 best UG projects** received rewards from **VTU of Rs. 5000/- each** and **one of them bagged a cash prize of 25,000/- from VTU**.
- **One Project** funded by **ISHRAE**

### 7. FDPS AND CONFERENCES HELD

- International Conference On Topical Transcends in Science, Technology and Management (**ICTTSTM 2018**) was organized during **AUGUST 2018**. **All departments were involved** in the conference.
- We were able to attract **146 papers from all parts of the country and globe**. We had **10 papers from other countries**. 86 papers were presented in the two days conference held on **17th and 18th August 2018**.
- **16 FDPs/workshops** has been conducted during last 2 semesters by various departments.
- **MOOC certifications** are mandatory for every faculty as per self appraisal.



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- 20 guest lectures rendered by our faculty at various institutions.
- Number of **Books published** are - 2 Nos.
- Number of **Research Papers published** are - 40 Nos.
- Number of **Conferences/Symposiums/Seminars conducted** by the college are - 16.
- Number of **International Conferences / Symposiums / Seminars** attended by the teachers are - 3.
- Number of **National Conferences / Symposiums / Seminars** attended by the teachers are - 152.
- Number of **Guest Lectures** delivered by our lecturers are - 20.

- Ms. Navya .K., 2018 ECE passed out student has been granted **international travel support of Support of USD 400** to present the paper entitled "**Design and analysis of silicon ring resonator for bio-sensing application**" at **SPIE Optical Systems Design 2018 symposium Frankfurt, Germany** during May 2018.
- Ms. Neduri Shruthi, final year ECE student, got a unique and a wonderful opportunity to present a paper in the **International Conference called PHOTOPTICS 2018**, Conference which was held at Funchal, Madeira, Portugal from 25th to 27th January 2018.

In the current month we had 2 companies visiting SVIT campus for 2019 Batch Hiring of software Engineers, namely **M/s. Milople & M/s. Mphasis** with total selects of 8 for the role of Associate Software Engineer. The market is sluggish and going slow with regard to hiring from Tier 2 & Tier 3 institutes for 2019 Batch.

TCS has invited for a National Qualifier test – **TCS Ninja**, which is scheduled on **Sept 2 & 3** for first Round.

## 12. NSS ACTIVITIES

- The National Service Scheme (NSS) is an Indian government-sponsored public service program.
- The **NSS unit** of the college has **500 student members** and approved by VTU. The unit is headed by **Dr. Harish H T, Librarian & NSS Program Officer**.
- NSS Unit has organized several events like **blood donation camp, Swatch Bharath Abhiyan, Tree Adoption Program, Pulse Polio Camp, Dr. B R Ambedkar Jayanthi**.

## 13. SPORTS

- Our college students participated in **VTU intercollegiate Athletic Meet**, Cricket, Basketball, Volleyball, Football, Table Tennis, Archery and **VTU'S intercollegiate Youth Festival**. Students won medals and laurels during the academic year 2017.
- Mr Mahesh Kumar (8<sup>TH</sup> Semester), Department of Information Science and Engineering has been selected to RCB for IPL 2018.
- **ROAD MAP FOR 2018-19**
- **Improvisation of results** – particularly in lower semester (I and II).
- Working on **reducing dropouts** and **non-eligible students** to **less than 5%**
- **Filing of** at least **6 patents** during 2018-19.

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- Enhancing R & D activities and funding.
- Strategizing to **increase placements** for Mechanical and Civil Engineering students.

**Resolution:** The Report about the progress of the Institution, aged just 10 years, is in fact lauded by the members present and approved.

**SUBJECT - 2** To read and record the proceedings of the previous meeting held on 16/12/2017 (circulated to all the members as Annexure - 1)

The Proceedings of the previous meeting was read over and the same has been taken on record after ratification by the members.

**Resolution:** Minutes of the previous Meeting's Proceedings ratified.

**SUBJECT - 3** Report on admission details and students' strength in the college for the year 2018-19 (circulated to all the members as Annexure - 2).

Chairman said that a wonderful job has been done this year for ensuring that all the seats in all the branches are filled up. He said that enough publicity work has been done this time. Our main stream of admissions is from 'word of mouth'.

Because of many reasons such as - students choosing unsuitable careers, unsuitable branches in engineering if they join engineering or late realization and students failing to take right decision in the right time and wrongly sticking to or following their close friends, etc. they fail to join the college of their choice in time culminating in the non-filling of the sanctioned strength in the colleges, particularly in Engineering Colleges.

Chairman further said that Prof. Padmareddy A M and Prof. Y. Jayasimha have spared no efforts to maximize the admissions.

Students are crazy of CS and IS with the wrong notion that they are going to get the jobs easily. Some parents/students are particular about the placement without knowing that it depends upon their performance and impression during the time of interview.

Members were also of the opinion that the mushrooming of the private Universities are another hindrance where same faculties do lessons, same faculties set exam papers and even same faculties make corrections. As such, the authenticity at all these levels is questionable. It is surmised that they push the students just like that without sticking to the quality of education. This easy going of studies in these private universities has perhaps encouraged the students to join these private universities instead of the colleges coming under VTU where every step is being kept as per the set norms of the University and the transparency is transparent due to effective and strong reins of VTU. However, as of now, the admissions are 65% approximately against the admissions during the previous academic year i.e., 85%.

**Resolution:** Workable strategies are to be chalked out for the improvement of the admissions since for the growth and the stability of any organization the vitamin money plays a significant role.

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**Subject - 4** Report on the performance of students in the VTU exams of Odd and Even Semesters of 2017-18 (circulated to all the members as Annexure - 3)

Sri Rajashekara Reddy said that the result in Civil Engineering is at the lowest ebb compared to the results of other departments. He also opined that this is because of the reason that the students who join for the Civil Engineering are mostly from the Management Category who are normally poor in studies, especially mathematics which never penetrates into their brains.

The members opined that the strategies to be adopted in feeding the students with tough subjects without much ado will have to be collected from all the departments for the improvement of the results in the future examinations. Principal mentioned about the strategies chalked out by the departments to tackle tough subjects as did in Maths - 2 where this year the results recorded 81% compared to that of last year i.e., 68%. Dr Subramanya Swamy said that in spite of covering all the modules the results are not forthcoming up to the expectation of the college.

Members opined that the students' strength, income and results are the three components which will decide the future of any educational institution and to improve all the three components what actions are to be taken ought to be taken to stay firmly in the field of education.

**Resolution:** Strategies to be worked out for the improvement of the results.

**SUBJECT - 5** Ratification of the appointments of Teaching & Non/Teaching staff made from 01/11/2017 till 30/06/2017. (Circulated to all the members as Annexure - 4)

Chairman said that three persons are appointed and 17 persons have been relieved. Among relieved, only few have left on their own and majority has been relieved as per the terms of their appointment order. We go by the students' appraisal in case of faculties as ultimately they are the supreme judges. And naturally the non-performers have to pack up. However, they would be given warning call after the first appraisal and even after that if they do not improve, relieving them of their duties becomes inevitable and that is why in the aspect of results our college is not lagging behind. Chairman also said that equal amount of appointments are made during the following month to see that the chariot moves without faltering.

For a question by Sri Rajashekara Reddy, Principal answered that the MBA is doing well and even the admissions are good.

Dr Subramanya Swamy asked whether Professors are there in all the departments. Principal answered affirmatively and said except in EEE all other Engineering Departments have Professors with PhD qualification.

**Resolution:** The members appreciated and approved the system that is in vogue for the retention or otherwise of the faculties appointed.

**SUBJECT - 6** Ratification of Purchases made for the laboratories and constructions made in the Institution during the period from 01/11/2017 to 6/9/2018 (circulated to all the members as Annexure - 5).

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For a query as regards to Purchase Policy, Principal said that there is a policy where atleast three quotations are obtained from different sources of supply for the purchase of each item and the suppliers are called and negotiated for the lowest price without compromising the quality of the items purchased and based upon such negotiations the purchases are being initiated.

**Resolution:** The members are satisfied with the existing practice followed for Purchases and the Purchases made during the period from 01/11/2017 to 6/9/2018 are ratified.

**SUBJECT - 7** Ratification of decision to close M.Tech Pograms - M.Tech (VLSI & ES) and M.Tech (CSE) (circulated to all the members as Annexure - 6).

Principal explained the impracticability in running the M.Tech Courses. Chairman said that during last academic year only one student was there.

Hence, as per the decision taken in the last Governing Council Meeting the letters were sent to AICTE, VTU and government of Karnartaka for closure of M.Tech programs and the same was approved by AICTE, VTU and Government of Karnataka.

**Resolutuion:** After hearing the pros and cons of keeping the above said M.Tech Courses, the members ratified the closure of the M.Tech. courses.

**SUBJECT - 8** Budget approval for 2018-19 (circulated to all the members as Annexure - 7)

Budget was presented by the Principal. The members did not find anything to debate on the matter.

**Resolution:** The members approved the Budget for 2018-19 unanimously.

**SUBJECT - 9** Report on Placement and Training Activities during 2017-18 and plans for 2018-19 (circulated to all the members as Annexure - 8)

Principal, placing the details of activities during 2017-18 and plans for 2018-19 before the members, said that we are putting all out efforts in the field of placement. However, he said, that placement is not up to the mark in case of EEE, Civil Engineering and Mechanical Engineering Students. (Dr Subramanya Swamy said that the parents approach him with the firm agenda whether their ward would get a job after the course completion. He said, jocularly, that he questions such parents what their motto is - whether to educate their ward or to get him/her an appointment and if their agenda is to get him/her an appointment, to search for a job for him/her with immediate effect instead of admitting him/her to the college!)

Principal said that at present, students are being trained by M/s Zestech and their training is felt satisfactory. In case of Civil engineering Department, the students are trained by ACCE. Dr Subramanya Swamy gave a good suggestion, ie., to get help from the alumnus.

**Resolution:** The members appreciated and were satisfied with the activities in Placement Cell and approved.

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**Subject - 10** Report on the achievements in Sports, Cultural and Co-curricular activities during the academic year 2017-18. (Circulated to all the members as Annexure - 9)

Chairman said that the college is giving due encouragement for sports, cultural and other co-curricular activities. He further said that our boys and girls have won many prizes during the previous academic year. They are good in Kabaddi, especially, and they have lot of plans for the academic year 2018-19, he said.

**SUBJECT - 11** Approval of Service Rules of SVIT.

Chairman narrated that a draft copy is ready and it has been handed over to the Review Committee constituted for the purpose under the Chairmanship of Prof. Y Jayasimha, Dean (Faculty) and also a member of Governing Council to review the draft SVIT Service Rules and to suggest modifications / additions / deletions, if any. Principal said that as per the suggestions of Prof. Rajashekar Reddy all the Service Rule Books have been procured and provided to the Review Committee to come out with an uncompromising Service Rules for SVIT.

However, due to hectic activities, one after the other, involving all the Review Committee Members, the Committee could not complete the task entrusted and the Chairman of the Review Committee pleaded for some more time. Hence, the Members present decided to defer the matter to the next G C Meeting.

At this juncture, Sri Rajashekar Reddy suggested to procure Book pertaining to Business Transaction Rule, especially with the Government agencies. He said that he is going to spare his copy for the time being.

**SUBJECT - 12** Any other matter with the permission of the Chairman (**AOS**)

**AOS - 1** Dr Subramanya Swamy said that for any improvement the basic necessity is money. However, he said, that lot of things have been done under the able guidance of Prof. M R Holla, Chairman and able academic leadership of the Principal, Dr H S Ramesh Babu which needs to be appreciated without looking back and forth.

Dr Subramanya Swamy said that the launching of Incubation Centre is a very good idea. He felt that the students will get an opportunity to have their own entrepreneurship, a higher goal indeed, to be a boss instead of searching for a job as an employee to work under somebody.

He suggested to adopt digital class room concept with recording facility, especially for tough subjects and this will certainly help the students in hearing and understanding what could not understand during the initial lecture hour. But, those points which the student could not grasp or understand properly needs to be clarified. This type of repetition helps the students who are average or below average in understanding the things taught. However, he said that, this needs further investment.


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Dr Subramanya Swamy said that if we want to stand out we will have to do something special.

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


