Principal said that in CSE the percentage is 100% in 8th Semester. In 2nd Semester it is good as the percentage of passes is 92%. The members felt that at present all the students are opting for circuitous branches but the trend is likely to reverse shortly and there will be good demand for ME and CV Courses and this should be kept in mind. Dr C K Subbaraya said that apart from manufacturing engineers they should take up relevant subjects as per the demand for different knowledge in the present scenario. Principal said that the students are aware of this situation. He also said that lot of enquiries are coming up from the diploma qualified working professionals for joining engineering courses in ECE, CSE and Mechanical Courses.

Diploma qualified working professions are good in practical. We have to conduct classes from 4-30 PM till 7-00 PM.

Members are of the opinion that there will be a good demand for BCA compared to BBA. Even for B.Com there is a good demand. AICTE has given permission to run BCA and BBA courses in the Engineering College.

It is mentioned by the Principal that in MBA 4th semester the result is 100%

An amount of Rs.3,13,87,412/- was spent toward purchases during the period under review.

Prof. Holla asked whether new cameras have been installed. Principal said affirmatively that the cameras have also been fitted in all the class rooms and laboratories including in the rooms of the new building.

Principal said that we have opened combined laboratories wherein 65 systems have been installed instead of 30 in the existing laboratories for the purpose of conducting combined laboratories.

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When Prof. M R Holla asked whether the proper procedure is being followed for the purchases, Member Secretary replied that the Purchases are being made strictly as per the laid down policy and procedure, ie., calling quotations from minimum three different parties, negotiating with them for lowering the prices and working out the corresponding services offered by the suppliers, warranty, guarantee, etc. by a team of Purchase Committee comprising of the Management and concerned department heads and then only Purchase Order will be raised in favour of the suitable supplier.

Principal informed the Governing Body that the NAAC – AQAR (Annual Quality Assurance Report) for the year 2022-23 has been successfully submitted to NAAC Authorities on 29th December 2023.

**Resolution:** The members appreciated and approved the submission of NAAC – AQAR for the year 2022-23.

# SUBJECT-10 Submission of NBA - Compliance Report for the three branches ECE/CSE/ISE.

Principal informed the Governing Body that the NBA – Compliance Report for the three branches ECE/CSE/ISE has been successfully submitted to NBA Authorities on 29<sup>th</sup> December 2023. Further Principal said that the Compliance could be submitted only for three departments due to 'ineligible admission level of students' in Civil and Mechanical Engineering programs.

**Resolution:** The members appreciated NBA – Compliance Report only for the three branches ECE/CSE/ISE due to inevitability.

### SUBJECT-11 Establishment of following Centers of Excellence:

- (a) 5 G Lab
- (b) AIML Lab
- (c) Photonics Lab

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#### (d) Outdoor Lab

Principal explained that by opening the Centers of Excellence, it will create opportunity for our students to work as Interns on handsome stipend basis – 10 students who have completed '5th semester and above that' are qualified for each Center, for two years. In this connection, Lab to Market has given a draft MOU also for our acceptance. Principal said that as per the MOU even the cost of Investment for infrastructure will be borne by Lab to Market only.

When Prof. M R Holla asked whether the rooms have been identified Principal answered affirmatively.

Principal said that for each patent germinated, Lab to Market would provide an amount of Rs.50,000/- to the Institution.

At this stage, Dr H S Ramesh Babu said that SVIT is a good Institution and has earned good name and fame. Dr Y Jayasimha expressed that it is a positive trend.

After giving lot of motivating talk, Mr Yatheendra T J said that no opportunity should be left as adage goes in Kannada "ಧಾರುಣಿಯ ನಡಿಗೆಯಲಿ ಮೇರುವಿನ ಗುರಿ ಇರಲಿ". Further he said that for conducting variegated activities for the improvement of the Institution in all respects, the Institution better become Autonomous as soon as possible.

**Resolution:** After thorough deliberation Members appreciated about the opening of Centers of Excellence in association with Lab to Market for the improvement of the Institution.

# SUBJECT-12 Infrastructure Progress of Girls' Hostel Building for the year 2023-24.

Principal said that about 160 outstation girl students are residing in different PGs outside the campus due to want of accommodation in the existing Institution's Girls Hostel. Among them about 70 outstation girl students are residing in the PGs arranged by the Institution providing them free transport facility and, therefore, he expected the Girls Hostel Annex which is under construction to be ready by September 2024. Even the parents are after him, he said, as they expected their female wards to stay safely inside the Campus during off-college hours.

**Resolution:** The members in general and Dr Y Jayasimha, in particular assured that the Girls Hostel Annex which is under construction would be ready, at least partially, say one or two floors, by September 2024 and expressed that they are equally concerned about the safety and security of the girl students.

SUBJECT-13 Ratification of Research Policy.

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Principal expressed the new features of revamped Research Policy such as giving Scholarship of Rs.25,000/- and holidays on Saturdays to the PhD Pursuers provided they publish worthwhile Articles which satisfies the tenets set for considering for scholarship and holidays. He said that already one scholar is benefited in the department of Computer Science and Engineering. Such incentives are necessary to encourage more Faculties to pursue PhD.

KSCST fostered IPR Cell is already working for the identification of scholars for the generation of as many publications as possible and taking the same through the windows for obtaining patents even. About 16 articles have been identified for the purpose of obtaining patents. Principal said that there are both part time and full time research scholars. In fact, this is one of the criteria for NIRF. More the publications more the recognition. (see **ANNEXURE - 6**).

**Resolution:** Members were happy about the Research Policy and the developments that is taking place in this direction and approved the same unanimously.

#### SUBJECT-14 Ratification of Policy formulated for achieving Best Results.

**Resolution:** The Members have gone through the same and felt the necessity of uniformity in fixing the emoluments; proportionate to their ranks, their output and the time spent and approved the same unanimously.

### SUBJECT 16 Ratification of Plagiarism Policy.

Principal placed before the Governing Body the Plagiarism Policy for consideration and approval for application by BE, MBA, PhD Students

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as well as staff. He said that at present 'Turnitin' and 'drillbit' Plagiarism filters are being used. (ANNEXURE-9)

Mr Yathindra T J said that the path of learning is infinite. One should develop inquisitive attitude for becoming a good researcher. 'One should not worry about the depth to be dug to get a precious metal'. Mr R Srinivas Raju said that the students are confined to commonly appearing questions in the examination with a view to just get through in the examination. With such an attitude the toiling in the research work is next to impossibility. Unless one is confident of coming across precious metal by digging deep he will never do that job.

Concluding, it was felt that such policies are required for inducing Researchers to publish irrejectable Articles.

**Resolution:** With the intention of inducing Researchers to publish irrejectable articles the members felt that such Policy is required and approved the Plagiarism Policy.
